Estimated Time: 5 - 10 minutes


Age range: All grades (ideal for younger students)

# **Background Information:**

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## 'In Grandma's Attic' Game

### Instructions:

- 1. Each round of this game starts with someone saying, "I climbed up into grandma's attic and I found a \_\_\_\_\_."
- 2. The first round of the game begins with someone stating an object that they "found in grandma's attic" that starts with an "A".

For example, the first player might say, "I climbed up into grandma's attic and I found an <u>Anaconda!</u>"

- 3. The next player must come up with a new object that they found that starts with a "B".
- 4. The game continues, in order, until the entire alphabet has been used!
