What's Wrong with This Picture?

'What's Wrong with This Picture?' Answer Key

1. Leave what you find. You can take pictures of flowers and admire them from where they are, but they should not be collected.
2. Dispose of waste properly. Nothing should be left behind by you when you go camping. Be sure to carry everything back with you and dispose of it properly.
3. Travel and camp on durable surfaces. Climbing up or down a hill like this without a proper trail can cause erosion, damage vegetation, and be potentially dangerous for the people walking on it.
4. Minimize campfire impacts. Campfires should be kept small and in a fire pit, and always have water nearby to avoid them from getting out of control.
5. Respect wildlife. Holding wildlife like this could stress them out. Wildlife should only be observed from a distance.
6. Leave what you find. Cool rocks, petrified wood, and other natural objects that you find while in the outdoors should remain as you find them.
7. Plan ahead and prepare. Before heading out on a camping trip, be sure to look at the weather forecast and bring the proper equipment to be prepared for any weather event that could happen.
8. Be considerate of other visitors. Group sizes should be kept small while hiking so that you do not disrupt other visitors' experiences and make them less enjoyable.
9. Dispose of waste properly. All food scraps should be carried out with you and disposed of properly. Even though apple cores will eventually decompose, they can be harmful for wildlife to eat and are not pleasing for other visitors to look at.
10. Respect wildlife. Animals should be observed from a distance to respect their space and not alter their activity.
